Cub Scout Day Camp: “The camp that comes to the boys” is an organized 5-day program for all ages of Cub Scouts conducted by local trained volunteer leadership during the day time hours. The scouts are supervised by den and pack leaders. Activities include rank advancement opportunities, crafts, archery, bb-guns, sports, and much more.

Webelos New Camp: Our newest summer camping adventure is for Webelos I & Webelos II Scouts conducted by trained leadership at the Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation. Scouts will participate in activities geared toward helping them earn their Webelos rank and Arrow of Light Award. This camp will be an introduction to the Boy Scout summer camping experience.

Cub Scout Adventure Camp: This camp is an organized overnight camping program for all ages of Cub Scouts conducted by trained leadership at Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation. Scouts and parents participate with den and pack leaders in a theme-oriented outdoor program. Activities normally include crafts, nature, archery, bb-guns, swimming, boating, and much more.

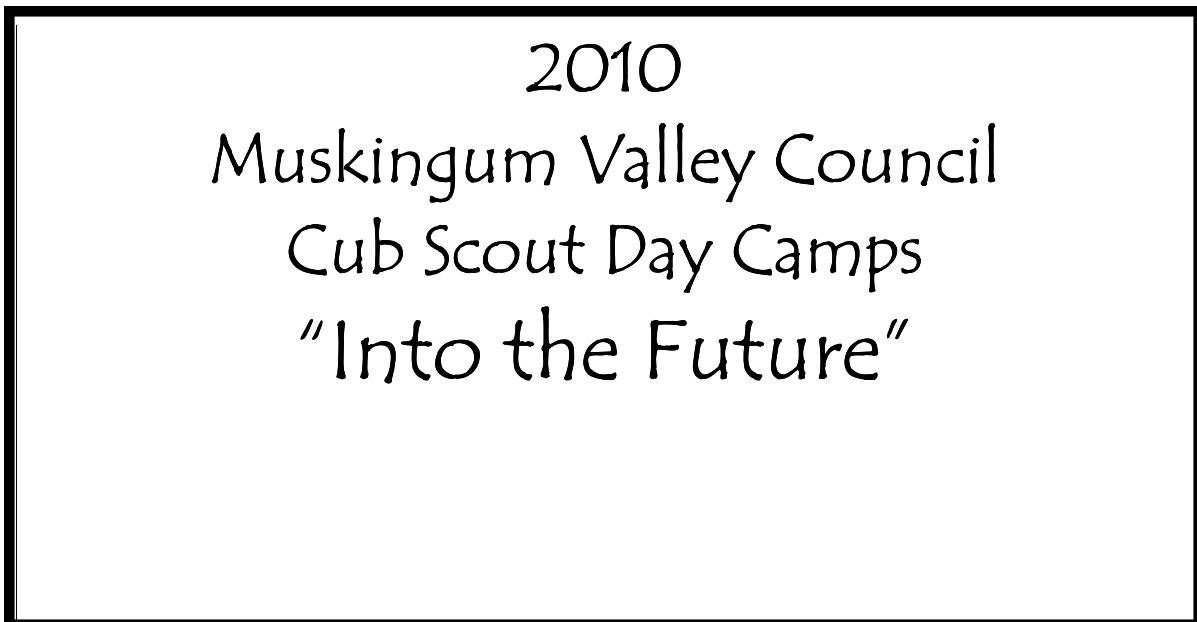

## **REGISTERING FOR DAY CAMP**

*(Please read carefully, there are some changes from last year).*

"Into the Future" is the general theme for the 2010 Cub Scout Day Camp. Registrations should be collected by the Pack and turned in as a **group**. All registration must be turned in to the Council Service Center, not the Day Camp Directors.

Scouts who are registered for Day Camp by the camp deadline can attend for just \$45.00. This includes a Day Camp Tee shirt and all program and craft materials.

Each Day Camp has a registration deadline approximately four weeks before the first day of camp (see next page for exact dates). Any Scouts who register after the deadline but before the first day of camp will pay an additional \$10 (for a total

of \$55.00). Scouts who wait until the first day of camp must pay an additional \$15 (for a total of \$60.00). Mailed registration must be postmarked by the deadline to receive the lowest fee.

Early registration is encouraged to give the staff accurate counts for Tee shirts and program supplies. Ordering additional materials creates extra expense for all Day Camps. **PLEASE REGISTER EARLY!**

There is no charge for adults attending as chaperones. Non-Scout children of chaperones may attend for \$1 per day. Craft items, if available, may be purchased for an additional fee.

See the middle of this flyer for the council's refund policy.

### **THE RULES FOR "INTO THE FUTURE"**

- Walkers may bring non-Scout children. The charge is one dollar per day, plus any additional fee for craft items, food, etc. Non-Scout children must be accompanied by a parent at all times.
- Shoes (no open toes shoes) and socks must be worn AT ALL TIMES in camp by all in attendance.
- Boys not participating with their Pack must be accompanied by an adult. It is the parents' responsibility to arrange an adult partner if they cannot stay with their sons at camp.
- It is recommended that Packs have two adult walkers for every 5 boys to satisfy two-deep leadership.
  - No Scout may leave camp before the end of the day without checking with the camp director.
  - Only those authorized to do so may pick a Scout up from camp.
  - No Scout may cross a road or railroad tracks unless accompanied by an adult.
  - Scouts and adults are expected to respect established boundaries of the camp site. Off-limit areas will be pointed out the first day of camp.
  - All medications must be given to the first aid person the first day of camp. See the middle of this flyer for additional information.

**Base fees:** \$45 if paid by camp deadline. Base fee will apply for new scouts that join after deadline, but before 1st day of camp

**Adults:** Free.

- Add \$10 (for a total of \$55) if registered after the camp deadline, but before the first day of day camp.
- Add \$15 (for a total of \$60) if not registered until the first day of day camp.

**Non-Scout children of chaperones:** \$1 per day, plus any additional fee for craft items and extra activities.

**Extra T-shirts:** \$10 for sizes up to Adult XL, \$12 for 2XL, 3XL, & 4XL (advance orders only on 4XL).

- and get in for free that weekend. See the council website for more information.
2. Adventures in Reading is an event in conjunction with Galaxy Press. This event is being held on the lawn of the Council Service Center on Saturday, July 3rd from 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm. All types of special activities are being planned for that day. Watch the website for more details.

## WHAT IF OUR PACK IS NOT PLANNING TO PARTICIPATE?

If your Pack is not planning to participate in the council's summer program, but your son is interested in attending, here is what you should do:

1. Talk with your Pack leadership. They may be under the false assumption that the Scouts and their parents are not interested in participating. Remind them that the promise of summer camp is one of the major reasons boys join Scouting. Volunteering as camp coordinator may help.
2. If the unit leadership is still not interested, talk to the other parents. Get a small group of interested Scouts together and participate, with parents taking turns as chaperones.
3. If you have trouble getting a group together from your Pack, contact other units in your area and see if they would mind letting your son tag along. Make sure you volunteer to help. We can assist you in this step.
4. If all else fails, contact the Council Service Center and ask for help. It is the council's goal to make sure every boy who wants to go to summer camp is given the opportunity.

### SCOUTING DOLLARS AT WORK FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

Muskingum Valley Council believes summer camp should be experienced by all Scouts, regardless of their financial status. That is why several thousand dollars is budgeted each year to help the less fortunate with their summer camp fees. Funding for camperships comes from Friends of Scouting and the popcorn sale.

Campership request forms are available at the Council Service Center as well as roundtable. They must be filled out and returned to the Service Center as soon as possible to be reviewed by the council committee.

Leaders should encourage the parents of needy Scouts to complete a campership form. Leaders may not fill out the form on a family's behalf.

The forms must be filled out by the Scout's parents, they should be turned in no less than six weeks before the Scout leaves for camp, because funding is limited.

Youths who show need may receive a campership of up to 50 percent of the camp fee, dependent upon availability of funds and the number of campership requests received by the council.

Camperships are only available to youth from Muskingum Valley Council participating in programs run by the Muskingum Valley Council. The funds to support camperships come from the Friends of Scouting program, the popcorn sale, and the United Way.

### Council Policy Regarding Medications

For the health and safety of our Scouts, all medications must be turned in to the camp first aid officer upon registering the first day of camp. No Scout will be allowed to carry or self-administer any medications, including over-the-counter products such as aspirin.

All medication must be in the original container. Prescription medication must have the Scout's name and dosage instructions clearly visible on the original label. Medications are given out at sick call after each meal. If a Scout needs to take medication at a time other than meal time, this needs to be on the health form. Campers with "epi" pens or inhalers may carry them, but the medication must be logged with the health officer.

### REFUND POLICY

As a general rule, once fees are paid and a Scout has committed to come to a Muskingum Valley Council Summer Camp, those fees are not refundable if the Scout fails to attend camp. Packs may, however, transfer the paid fees to cover another Scout.

The council understands that emergencies do sometimes arise, and through no fault of the Scout he may find himself unable to attend camp.

In these cases, refund requests should be submitted in writing to the council where they will be reviewed by a committee for consideration.

**REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE SUBMITTED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF CAMP FOR CONSIDERATION. NO REFUND REQUEST WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1st.**

## CUB ADVENTURE WEEKEND

### July 30 - August 1, 2010

#### 2010 Cub Scout Adventure Camp at Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation

"Back to the Future" is the theme for the 2010 Cub Scout Adventure Camp. This three-day, two-night event begins 3:00 P.M. Friday, July 31st and ends around noon on Sunday, August 2nd. The camp will be held at the Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation near Conesville in Coshocton County.

Cub Scouts of all ages are invited to come and take part in a super fun-filled weekend. Several special events are being planned as part of the activities.

Boys will take part in thrilling, old-fashioned summer camp favorites, such as nature-related programs, fishing, swimming, and archery.

Cub Scout Adventure Camp is open to all registered

Cub Scouts and their families. Boys must register through their Cub Scout Pack and will camp together as a Pack.

Parents or adult partners are encouraged to attend and participate with their son. A minimum of two adults is required for every 10 boys attending Adventure Camp. Boys will not be able to spend the night or participate in activities unless they meet the requirement for minimum adult supervision.

Youth are only allowed to stay in the tent with their parents or legal guardians. Youth coming without parents must either sleep in tents by themselves or with another youth.

## How To Sign up for "Back to the Future"

To register for Adventure Camp, simply fill out the application available from your Pack Leaders or on the council webpage and give it to your Cubmaster or Pack Camp Coordinator right away.

Your Cubmaster or Pack Camp Coordinator needs to know how many boys are planning to attend Adventure Camp so they can arrange to have plenty of adult supervision. Remember, the fee increases by \$10 after June 26th. Also, parents, be sure to let the Pack know if you can help out by serving as an adult supervisor.

### Camp Fees

- \$80 per Scout if paid by June 26th at the Service Center.
- \$90 per Scout if paid after June 26th but by July 30th at the Council Service Center.
- \$100 per Scout if paid on the first day of Adventure Camp at camp.
- Adult & Sibling registration is \$35. Sibling will be permitted to participate in program activities based on availability of supplies.
- **Registration fees include a Tee-shirt for Scouts.** Tee shirts may not be available at camp for late registrations, but they will be issued if ordered.

Fees cover all meals, insurance, and program materials for the Scout. See the middle of this flyer for refund policy.

### Check-In Procedures

Check-in will begin at 3 p.m. and end at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, July 31st. Packs MUST check in as a group. No individuals will be checked in until the rest of the pack arrives. The first items on the agenda are double-checking the registration materials and conducting swim tests.

Boys should wear their swimming trunks under their clothes or have their trunks and towels in hand when they arrive so they can change quickly without having to sort through their gear to find them.

Scouts should also turn in their medications at this time. All medications will be stored in a locked cabinet and administered by the Pack leadership. Please see page 5 for the council's policy on medications.

Once health checks and swim tests are completed, Scouts will move in to their campsites and have a chance to unpack before the fun begins Friday evening.

Friday supper **will not** be provided. Please plan accordingly. (Domino's Pizza & Papa John's Pizza will both deliver to the Welcome Center.)

## WEBELOS FUN CAMP

### JUNE 11 - 13, 2010

#### 2010 Webelos Resident Camp at Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation

"A Bridge to the Future" is the theme for the 2010 Webelos Resident Camp. This three-day, two-night event begins with check-in at 4:00 pm Friday, June 11th and ends around noon on Sunday, June 13th. The camp will be held at the Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation near Conesville in Coshocton County.

Webelos Fun Camp is our newest edition to the summer camping schedule. Participating Webelos will camp like Boy Scouts in large tents on platforms with cots. In addition to earning Webelos requirements, the camp will transition the Webelos Scout from Cub Scout family style camping and prepare them for Boy Scout

summer camping.

Boys must register through their Cub Scout Pack and camp as a Den. Parents or adult partners do not have to attend the camp as long as the minimum of two adults for every 10 boys attending Resident Camp is met. Youth will share a tent with another youth or with their parent or guardian.

Webelos I & II Scouts are especially encouraged to participate in Adventure Camp, which will help fulfill several Webelos and Arrow of Light requirements. Webelos are ready for a more challenging adventure and the Webelos Fun Camp will provide this.

### How To Sign up for "A Bridge to the Future"

To register for Webelos Resident Camp, simply fill out the application available from your Webelos Den Leader or on the council webpage and give it to your Den Leader or Pack Camp Coordinator right away.

Your Den Leader or Pack Camp Coordinator needs to know how many boys are planning to attend Webelos Resident Camp so they can arrange to have plenty of adult supervision. Remember, the fee increases by \$10 after May 7th. Also, parents, be sure to let the Pack know if you can help out by serving as an adult supervisor.

### Camp Fees

This is a "Pilot Program" in 2010. Fees may change in following years.

- \$70 per Scout if paid by 14, 2010 at the Service Center.
- \$80 per Scout if paid after May 14th but by June 10th at the Council Service Center.
- \$90 per Scout if paid on the first day of Webelos Fun Camp at camp.
- Adult registration is \$35. **No sibling will be permitted to participate at this camp.**
- **Registration fees include a Tee-shirt for Scouts.** Tee shirt may not be available at camp for late registrations, but they will be issued if ordered.

Fees cover all meals, insurance, and program materials for the Scout. See Page 4 of this flyer for refund policy.

### Check-In Procedures

Check-in will begin at 4 pm and end at 6:00 pm on Friday, June 7, 2010. Webelos Dens MUST check in as a group. No individuals will be checked in until the rest of the pack arrives. The first items on the agenda are double-checking the registration materials and conducting swim tests.

Boys should wear their swimming trunks under their clothes or have their trunks and towels in hand when they arrive so they can change quickly without having to sort through their gear to find them.

Scouts should also turn in their medications at this time. All medications will be administered by the Webelos Resident Camp medical officer. Please see page 4 for the council's policy on medications.

Once health checks and swim tests are completed, Scouts will move in to their campsites and have a chance to unpack before the fun begins Friday evening.

Friday supper **will not** be provided. Please plan accordingly. (Domino's Pizza & Papa John's Pizza both will deliver to the Welcome Center.)

The first planned activity will be the opening campfire on Friday evening.

## Tents Available

Tents will be provided for those attending **Webelos Resident Camp**. Each camp tent features wooden floor boards and two cots. A mattress or sleeping pad needs to be brought from home.

Scouts and their families are encouraged to bring their own tents to **Cub Scout Adventure Camp**, but for those who do not own them, two-person Boy Scout tents are available. This will be the same style of tent listed above.

YOU MUST TELL US ON YOUR APPLICATION IF YOU NEED TO USE THE CAMP'S TENTS.

For both camps, each campsite also features potable water, a fire ring, trash can, fire fighting equipment, and latrine. You don't have to have camping equipment to participate in Webelos Fun Camp or Cub Scout Adventure Camp.

Reminder: When staying in tents, no youth will stay in the tent of an adult other than his or her parent or guardian.



## Tee Shirt Orders

A high quality Tee shirt depicting the camp's theme will be provided this year to all registered Scouts attending camp. The price of the Tee shirt is included in the camp fee.

Adults and siblings may order Tee shirts by filling in the appropriate blanks on the camp registration form (available at roundtables, the service center, and on the council web page).

Tee shirts will be available in the following sizes: Youth Medium & Youth Large and Adult Small through 4X-Large.

Because the Tee shirts are being special ordered, only those orders received prior to the appropriate deadline will be guaranteed to be there upon arrival. If you register after the deadline, you will receive your shirt, but it may be late.

A limited number of shirts may be available at the Trading Post for sale.

## Dining Hall Information

One thing about Cub Scouts: They are always hungry, especially after running around camp all day, soaking up sunshine and having fun.

To make sure they have plenty of energy for a full weekend of adventure, the dining hall at Muskingum Valley Scout Reservation will be serving hot, nutritious meals that kids love. There is no additional charge for the meals - they are included in the camp registration fee.

Starting with a Friday evening snack and ending with breakfast on Sunday, all meals will be provided for the weekend. Packs will need to eat before arriving at camp or bring an evening meal with them. Sack lunches, materials for a simple foil dinner or carry-in pizzas are good examples of quick and simple ideas for the Friday evening meal.

The following meals are provided in the weekend camp fee:

**Friday:** evening snack

**Saturday:** breakfast, lunch and supper.

**Sunday:** breakfast.

### What about snack food?

Candy, pop, chips and other Cub Scout survival foods will be available for purchase at the Trading Post.

Scouts are asked not to store snack food in their tents because it attracts critters like skunks and raccoons.

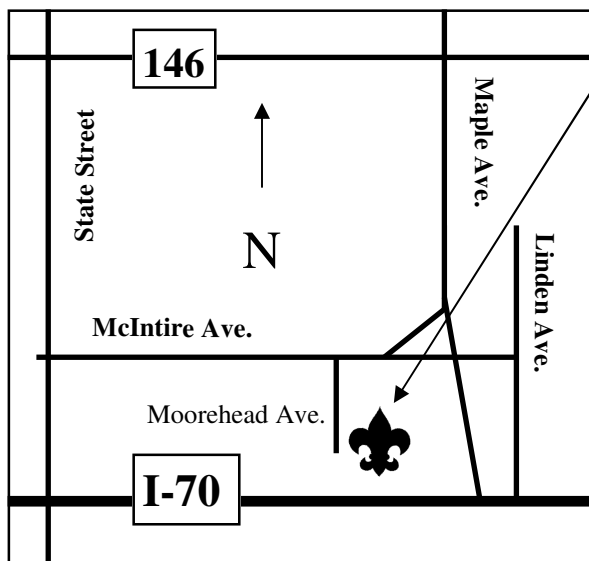
