Tom & Marj Tribbie



Tom and Marj Tribbie were both born and raised in Guernsey County. Marj graduated from Madison High School in 1952 while Tom graduated from Cambridge High School in 1944. They were married in 1954 and are the parents of four children, Melinda Matheson, (an Occupational Therapist in Lebanon, OH), Debbie (a homemaker in Louisville, KY), Stephen (an employee of General Dynamics in Clearwater, FL), and Terri Slack (owner/operator of the Bon-Ton Studio in Cambridge). They

are the proud grandparents of three granddaughters and eight grandsons. One of the grandsons is in the Cub Scout program.

Marj graduated from Dr. Brown's School of Technology and came back to Cambridge to work as a lab technician at Guernsey Memorial Hospital. Tom started his law practice in Cambridge and Byesville after serving in the Army and graduating from Ohio State Law School in 1952. Tom practiced law for fifty-five years, having retired in 2007. He served as President of the Guernsey County Bar Association. The firm he founded still carries the name "Tribbie, Scott, Plummer, and Padden." Marj retired from her work as a lab technician in 1956 to raise the fast arriving Tribbie children.

Tom was elected Prosecuting Attorney of Guernsey County in 1960 and served eight years. He was the Solicitor of the Village of Byesville for twelve years. In 1970, Tom and Marj operated the Tastee Freeze in the IGA Shopping Center. It was a favorite meeting place for Cambridge High School students. This exciting and interesting operation continued until 1982 when the business was sold.

Marj headed the Red Cross Blood program as a volunteer in Guernsey County for 27 years. She was successful in seeing that Guernsey County contributed more than its share to the life-saving endeavor. Tom is a 33rd degree Mason and has served as Secretary and President of Kambri Shrine Club and as the Chief Executive Officer of the Scottish Rite, Valley of Cambridge. He was also a Board Member of Guernsey Memorial Hospital, having served as the President in 1974 when the new extended facility was dedicated. He served on the Board of Directors of National City Bank and presently serves on the Board of Directors of the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District, having served as Board President during 2006-2007.

Marj and Tom have been members and past officers of the Unity Presbyterian Church in Cambridge. Marj has been particularly active in the "kitchen detail". They are members of the Cambridge Country Club and are avid fans of The Ohio State University Athletics program, having held season tickets to Buckeye football games for the past 61 years.

Plans for the future are tending to their rather large yard in Cedar Hills, spending more time at their cottage at Seneca Lake, and working in some time to travel.
