Clark Armstrong

Born July 21, 1918 in Cambridge, Clark spent several years as a Boy Scout and achieved the Star Rank. In 1936, Clark graduated from Cambridge Brown High School.

Clark married June Thomas on June 21, 1941, they have three children; Trudy Gibson, Jan Carnes and Kim Hayes who have blessed them with 10 grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Mr. Armstrong's involvement within the community is extensive. He belongs to the First Christian Church where he is a Sunday school teacher and a member of the choir. His involvement in the Church also includes being a past board chairman, deacon and elder.

On the state level Clark served on the Board of Trustees of Christian Church in Ohio serving 11 years as Vice-President and 1 year as President of the State Convention. He served for 19 years as the Chairman of Camp Christian Camp Committee. Clark was the President of State Christian men's Fellowship and received the Ohio Disciple of Merit Award, from the Christian Church in Ohio.

On the Church's national level, Clark served a three-year term on the Board of Trustees and a two-year term as National President of Christian Men's Fellowship as well as serving seven years on the National Week of Compassion Committee.

Mr. Armstrong's involvement in Guernsey County includes being a past president of Cambridge Kiwanis Club. He received their George F. Hixon Award and has also received the Kiwanian of the Year Award twice. Clark was named Jaycees Boss of the Year and received the small business man award by the Chamber of Commerce.

Clark served on the Salvation Army Board, YMCA Board, Living Word Board, Cambridge Chamber of Commerce Board, and Cambridge Merchants Board. Clark also served as past president of the Ohio State Association of Plumbing, Heating and Cooling Contractors.

Clark began his working profession in 1931 when he was hired at the Branthoover and Johnston Company. He became manager in 1940 and by 1944 owned 51 percent of the stock. Clark then enlisted in the United States Navy and served from 1944 through 1946. By 1955 Clark became President of Branthoover and Johnston. In 1977 Clark sold all of his stock and remained President and CEO until December 31, 1987 when he retired.
